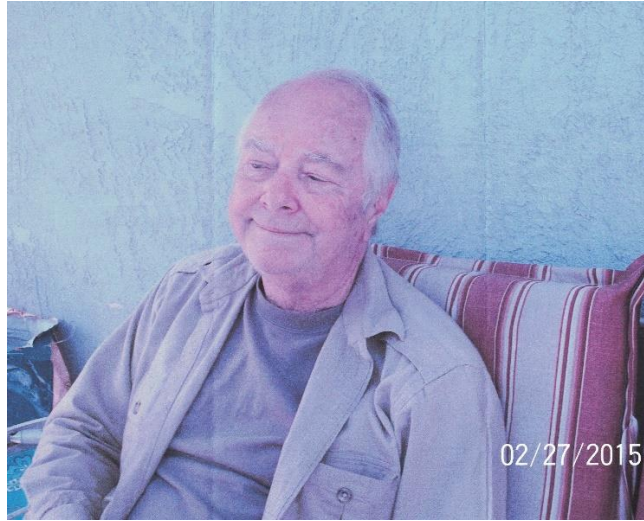


Roy Walter Potter

I watched a PBS story on Walt Disney and was amazed by the number of pictures with small changes that were required to animate films in the old days.
