

"I could tell stories of driving to Wisconsin for beer and crashing the car on the way home, dancing the night away at sock hops, and dinners at the Rotello home (more pork chops). But Nick was always the best storyteller; in fact, sometimes I did not recognize the stories when HE told them. And yet again ... High School, then rooming at Pharmacy School (Iowa's Drake University) and finding Kent Lachner to complete the triumvirate at the Alpha Tau Omega House. Great times. No money and lots of ketchup. Vietnam, then grad school for Nick and dental school for me.

"Marriage, kids, and careers did not keep us apart. We talked frequently and visited when we could and vacationed together often. We shared family weddings and long weekend trips with our favorite people. We went hiking with our sons in Colorado. We watched Nicky and Danis grow up. We picked blackberries, cooked salmon, and chased elk around Nick's backyard in the State of Washington - okay, we watched NICK chase elk around the yard; the entertainment value was not to be missed! We climbed Mount St. Helens in a white-out at the top of that Volcano that nearly killed us, and salmon fishing in Juneau, Alaska - ditto.

"The last time we spoke we were two guys just out of the hospital, talking about the future, laughing, and planning to eat pork chops for dinner. In my mind, we still are."

Nick was loved by many and will be dearly missed. In the words of Dr. Seuss, "Don't cry because it's over. Smile because it happened."
